Future Health Index 2021 is the largest survey of its kind analyzing almost 3,000 healthcare leaders in 14 countries, including 183 who work in informatics.

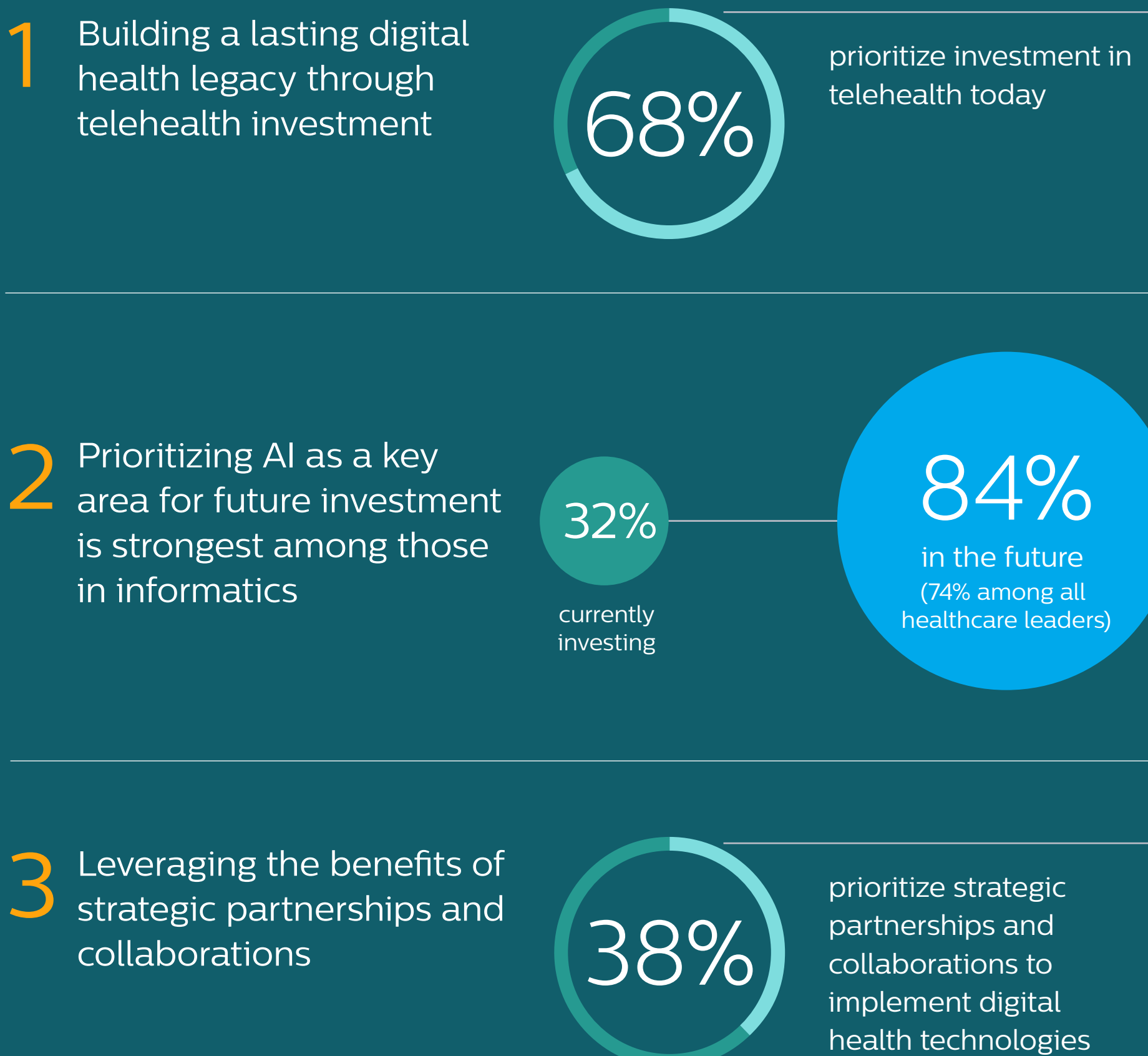

Healthcare leaders in informatics are positive about the future

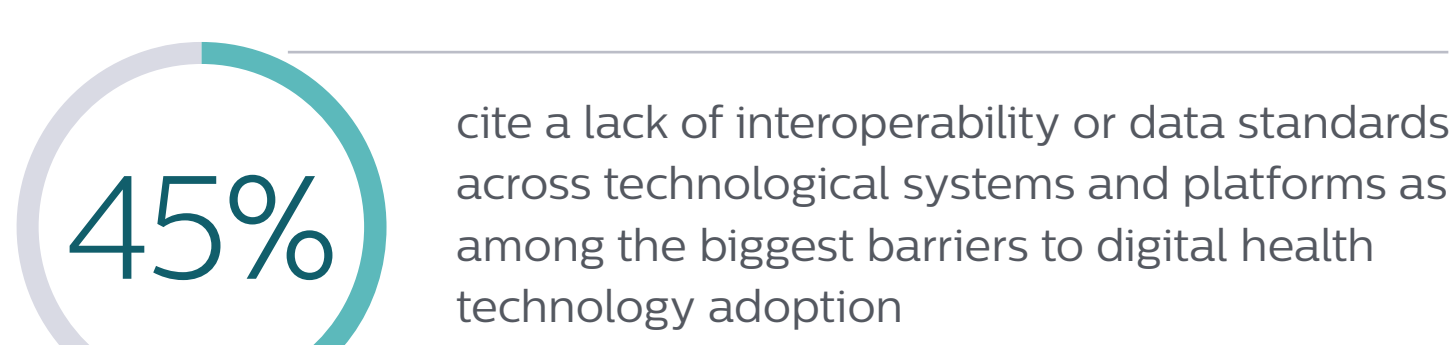
Leaders who work in informatics are confident in the ability of their hospital or healthcare facility and their country's healthcare system to deliver quality care three years from now:



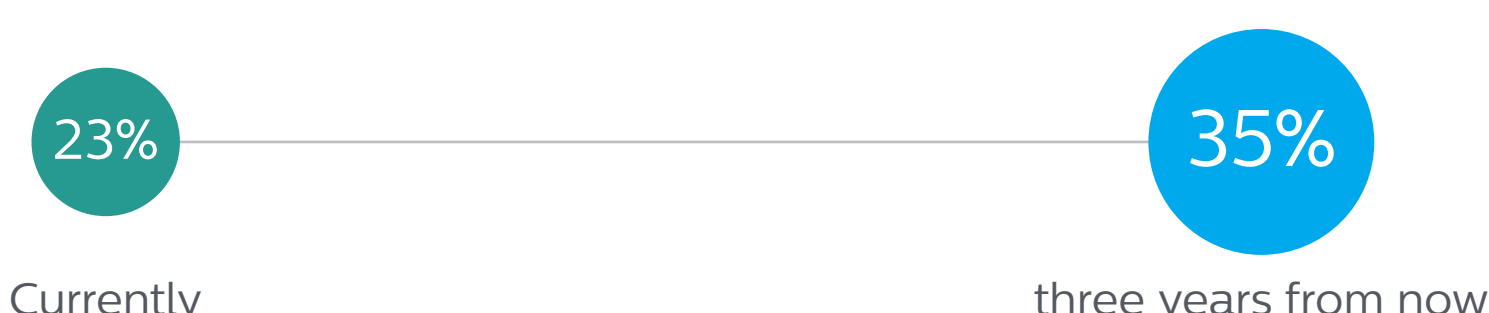
A three-step approach to digital transformation



Issues around interoperability and data security remain

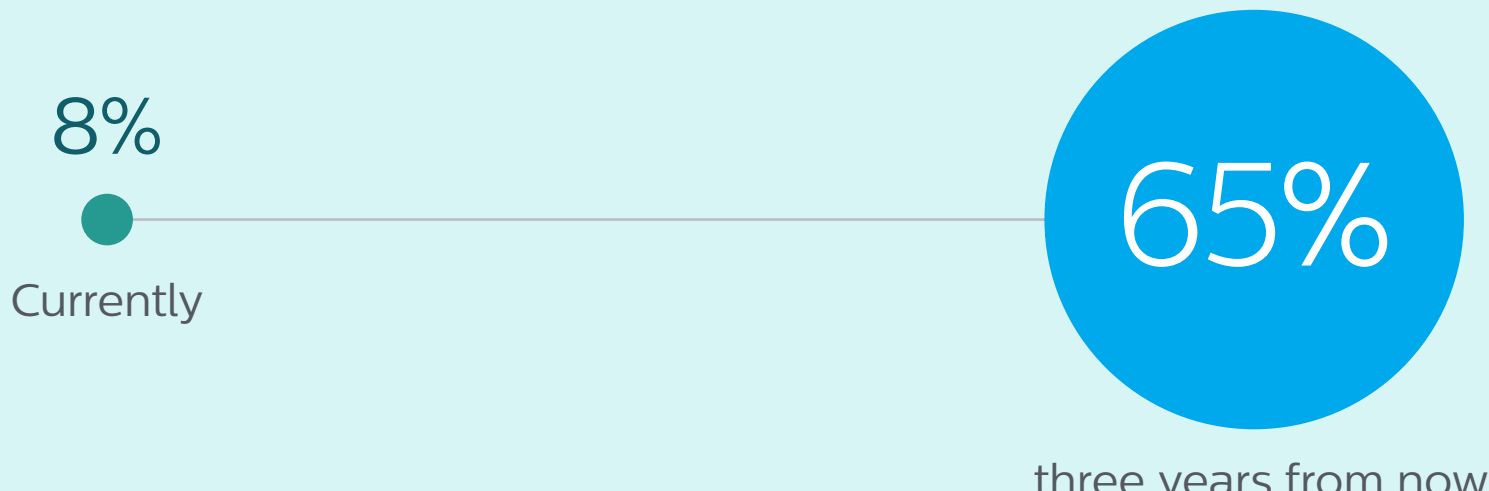


Ensuring the security and privacy of data is a growing priority:
